

REPORT OF THE CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE) COMMITTEE TO THE ACPV BOARD OF GOVERNORS

August 4, 2019

Last year, the American College of Poultry Veterinarian through the ACPV Continuing Education Committee organized the workshop titled “What’s New & Coming in Poultry Vaccination? Production, administration, & monitoring of tomorrow’s poultry vaccines”. The workshop took place on April 2, 2019, a day prior to the WPDC Annual Meeting in Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco, Mexico held in conjunction with the Mexican Association of Poultry Specialists’ (ANECA) Annual Meeting.

OBJECTIVES:

The objectives of this meeting were to highlight the future of poultry vaccines. The focus was on what new technology and R&D is progressing in the specific areas of production, administration, and monitoring of tomorrow’s poultry vaccines.

WORKSHOP OUTLINE:

It was a full-day workshop, from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The program included ten talks of 30 minutes each distributed into four sessions with four Q&A sessions, two coffee breaks, and a lunch period. Please review the agenda included at the end of this report.

NUMBER OF ENROLLEES:

There was a total 108 registered attendees, 92 paid attendees and 16 complimentary for speakers & high tier sponsors.

WORKSHOP EVALUATION:

Evaluation forms were distributed to the attendees and we received only 18 (17%) forms back. Most of the attendees provided very positive opinions about the workshop. Attendees also provided very positive opinions about workshop topics, and relevance of the workshop. Regarding audiovisual support, there were some concerns, as a few of the talks did not load on que. The main negative feedback involved the difficulty that existed in registering for the workshop through the ANECA website and the lack of technical support received during the process. Booking the hotel was also very difficult. Many actually booked hotels on their own separate from the conference rate as a result of so much frustration.

BUDGET:
