### Recommendation to ACPV Board on updating continuing education (CE) requirements.

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### This ACPV subcommittee was tasked with the following items to be completed prior to the February 2022 board meeting:

#### Committee Charge:

- 1. Update the policy which outlines the number and type of continuing education credits required to maintain diplomate status in the ACPV.
- 2. Determine if we should continue the current system of claiming pre-approved CE by just listing the meetings attended. The alternative is to require certificates to be uploaded.

#### Committee Products:

- 1. Updated policy document.
- 2. Updated CE submission form.

After an extensive review of other specialty board and state license requirements, the committee found that ACPV requires more frequent and larger numbers of CE to maintain board currency. The committee is not recommending any changes to frequency or total minimum quantity of CE. The committee also recommends retaining the 2 years out of 10 waivers on recertifying CE.

Rather, the committee recommends expanding the type of CE allowed to more closely align with the content on the board examination and what skills the membership utilizes in their professional work. Please see attachment one entitled "ACPV Exam Blueprint" to understand the areas of work stipulated.

Three general areas are covered by CE: 1) professional development, 2) scholarly activities, and 3) service or organizational activities. These activities are weighted accordingly. The committee recommends changing the weight given to some of the CE activities to more accurately reflect the time and learning involved; specifically around authorship activities such as publishing in refereed journals, peer-review of manuscripts, and service in leadership carry significant relative weight.

Table 1 summarizes the current ACPV CE distribution (see <a href="https://aaap.memberclicks.net/acpv-renewal-form#/">https://aaap.memberclicks.net/acpv-renewal-form#/</a>). Table 2 highlights the proposed modifications. The changes to the submission form follows table 2.

The committee welcomes any board questions or need for further clarification on these recommendations.

These activities are included as part of the testing blueprints as outlined in attachment 1. These include, but are not limited to media training, writing/communication workshops and non-poultry health/welfare seminars/webinars/conferences. CE for these activities will need to be approved by the CE committee. This will more accurately reflect skill development based on the ACPV exam blueprint.

#### **CE Submission Form**

The following areas to the CE submission form or process are recommended:

- 1. Pre-approved meetings/seminars/webinars: Include the maximum amount of approved CE, the dates and sponsoring organization in the drop down menu on the form. The diplomate will still need to enter the number of CE hours acquired, but everything else will autofill.
- 2. The committee does not recommend requiring the uploading of attendance certificates during the certifying process. Rather, the diplomate should retain those documents if there is a need to review them during the 10-year cohort auditing cycle.
