Dr. Jerry is a pathologist and Clinical Assistant Professor at the Turlock branch of the California Animal Health and Food Safety Laboratory (CAHFS), UC Davis. She is a co-coordinator of the CAHFS poultry diagnostic medicine residency program and is currently the Western Poultry Diseases Conference (WPDC) program chair. Dr. Jerry serves on a number of AAAP committees, including the Educational Committee and is the CAHFS NPIP representative. She is a diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Pathology (ACVP) and the American College of Poultry Veterinarians (ACPV). Dr. Jerry completed her DVM at the University of the West Indies, an internship in Pathobiology at Tuskegee University and her PhD and residencies at the University of Georgia, where her research focused on avian influenza in wild birds and commercial poultry. In 2019, Dr. Jerry was awarded the AAAP Reed Rumsey Award for basic research and commitment to advancement of the industry.
