I have been speaker in numerous conferences on various topics related to poultry production and health worldwide. I retired from Jefo Nutrition Inc. on December 31st 2012.

What are you doing now?

Retired but active in private consulting in poultry production issues.

I am also a course master with the "World Veterinary Education in Production Animal Health" (WVEPAH, www.wvepah.org). This organization, under the umbrella of the OIE and the University of Luxemburg, will give avian medicine courses to graduated veterinarians to make them competent in avian medicine and able to help implement the OIE policies worldwide. The first two week intensive courses will be given in Dakar, Senegal (March 17 to 28, 2014) and in Berlin, Germany (May 2014). The same courses will be given by others poultry veterinarians in Mexico, late spring 2014. Other teams will cover turkey, waterfowl and layers medicine in Canada, Thailand and France, in 2014 and 2015.
