About the cover

John Lancaster
(1918–1996)

Dr. John E. Lancaster launched his career in avian diseases in England where he was born, earned his veterinary degree from the University of Edinburgh, and held several positions before emigrating to Canada in 1957 where he joined the faculty of the University of British Columbia. In 1960 he moved to Ottawa where he was appointed chief of poultry disease programs with Agriculture Canada, a position he held until his retirement in 1980. He then joined Curtis Chicks, retiring for the second time in 1985. He was especially known for his work on eradication of virulent Newcastle disease and the control of Marek's disease in Canada. He was active in many international organizations including the American Association of Avian Pathologists where he was elected to life membership in 1983. He received the OIE Award of Merit in 1990.
