William R. Hinshaw 1896–1984

Dr. Hinshaw, a native of Michigan, earned his DVM from Michigan State University in 1923, his M.S. degree from Kansas State University and the PhD degree from Yale University. He held academic positions in avian microbiology at Kansas State (1923–1927), University of Massachusetts (1927–1929) and University of California, Davis (1929–1949). He completed his career as supervisory microbiologist at the US Biologic Laboratories at Fort Detrick, Maryland including administrative positions (Chief of the Virus and Rickettsia Laboratories and Liaison Officer in Animal Sciences) in 1966. He instigated the organization of the Northeastern Conference of Laboratory Workers in Pullorum Disease (later to become the Northeastern Conference on Avian Diseases) while at the University of Massachusetts. He was a Charter Member of AAAP and was very active in the Poultry Science Association, serving as President in 1950. He was an accomplished microbiologist holding Diplomate Status in two certifying Colleges (Board of Public Health and Veterinary Microbiology) and widely published in many prestigious refereed journals. He was an acknowledged expert in diseases of turkeys and was acclaimed for his research on the epidemiology of salmonellosis and arizonosis—recognized by the naming of one species *Arizona hinshawii*. Among his many awards and honors was the AAAP Special Service Award received in 1977.
