## **Information for Sponsors**

The third International Avian Respiratory Disease Conference (IARDC) will be held at the University of Georgia, Athens GA from May 14 to 17, 20124. As most of you likely know, this Conference is the American version of the International Symposium on Avian Corona- and Pneumoviruses and Complicating Pathogens held in Europe. The American version invites papers on all avian respiratory diseases excluding works exclusively on avian influenza. Anticipated sections will be on infectious bronchitis virus. infectious larvngotracheitis virus. Newcastle disease virus. avian metapneumovirus, and mycoplasma. The first International Avian Respiratory Disease Conference, held in 2011 at the University of Georgia, was an enormous success with over 180 attendees from all over the globe. The second Conference, held in 2018, was also a success and showcased Athens and The University of Georgia, and we expect the 2024 meeting to match our previous meeting efforts.

The organizing committee would greatly appreciate your pledge and contribution to help defray the costs of this important event. Registration fees cover some of the basic costs, however, we need to obtain additional funds to support travel assistance for renowned scientists as keynote speakers and graduate students who will be our lead scientists of tomorrow.
