ACPV Training Program Review Committee

Updated Items for this year:

1. The ACPV Training Program Committee re-evaluated the ACPV Training Program Standards and updated the criteria for any new applicants. Criteria for maintaining previously approved programs were also included. All updated ACPV Standards for new programs were approved by the Governors board in February 2011.
2. ACPV Training Program Application forms and annual review forms were updated and now in word documents.
 - a. Each Training program must fill out an Annual Review Form to update ACPV on any changes or new information the committee may need to keep the program approved. Deadlines and further information is on the forms.
 - b. All updated ACPV Training Program Application and Annual Review forms were approved by the ACPV Governors board in February 2011.
3. The committee also approved a new program, the Master of Avian Health and Medicine (MAHM) at the University of Georgia and University of Melbourne. This new program will need to be included in the annual review next year.

The following programs presently are in inactive or in probationary status:

University of Pennsylvania: Status is inactive

This ACPV Training Program has not had a student in the last 8-10 years due to lack of funding. Currently the program still remains but is trying to get funding for its support. According to the Standards (#8) there must be evidence of adequate financial support, staff, and facilities, including equipment consistent with internship/residency post-DVM education. Therefore we are putting this program inactive until there is adequate funding.

Ohio State: Status is inactive

The original application for this training program needs to be evaluated. It appears that these students are research focused and we are unsure how much interaction the students have with the industry, as part of the criteria in the standards (#7- There must be demonstration of a significant link or relationship with the formal training that involves direct contact with the poultry industry as reflected by case load/accessions, companies served, industry problems solved, and externship/internship arrangements with companies and ACPV poultry veterinarians. There must be a method for assessing field training and experience for each student.). Also, Dr. Jean Sanders is moving to another university in August and they will not meet the minimum 3 resident or affiliated faculty members who are Diplomates of the American College of Poultry Veterinarians with

credentials/experience in poultry medicine (#3). As a result this program will be inactive until these issues can be resolved.

University of Cal.–Fresno: Status is inactive

The training program at Fresno has been discontinued due to closure of CAHFS – Fresno Branch.

University Cal.-Davis: Status is inactive

The following programs are active and up to date on their requirements:

NC State University- The program is a 24 month degree program offering a non-thesis Masters of Specialty Veterinary Medicine (MSPVM). 3 students enrolled in 2011 including Kabel Robbins (graduating in June 2011), Annika Hoffman and Jocelyn Romano (starting at end of June 2011). Rosemary Marusak graduated from the program in 2010. This student applied and passed the ACPV Exam. The program is meeting all criteria for ACPV training program. Program is active and up-to-date.

Cal. Animal Health & Food Safety Lab System – Tulare and Turlock- The program is a 24 month program offering a degree in Avian Diagnostics and Production Medicine. The CAHFS is composed of a central reference lab located in Davis and branch laboratories in Turlock, Tulare and San Bernardino. Travel between branches and temporary reassignment to the central lab in Davis for more in-depth study in specific areas may be necessary. Faculty from Fresno are now part of CAHFS – Tulare. They are keeping the training programs at both Tulare & Turlock in case an avian resident applies to the Tulare branch. They currently have one student enrolled, Dr. Julie Kelly. There was not a student in the program last year, therefore there was not a graduate in 2010. No student applied or took the ACPV exam in 2010. The program is meeting all criteria for ACPV training program. Program is active and up-to-date.

University of Georgia - The program is an 18 month degree program offering a non-thesis Masters of Avian Medicine (MAM). There are 5 current students enrolled in the program. 3 students will be finishing in December 2011 (Denise Brinson, Peter O’Kane and Rodrigo Espinosa). 2 students, Anne Hurley Bacon and Blayne Mozisek, began the program in summer of 2011. 2 students finished December 2010 (William “Drew” Parker, Natalie Armour). 2 students from this program applied and passed the ACPV exam in 2010. The program is meeting all criteria for ACPV training program. Program is active and up-to-date.

Miss. State University- One student Josh Standridge graduated in 2011. There are no current students at this time. The program is meeting all criteria for ACPV training program. Program is active and up-to-date.

In accordance with the proposal adopted by the board per Dr. Tim Cummings in Jan. 1999, the six active programs have been reviewed by a committee member and have been found to be in compliance for the year 2011. The review documents have been placed in a file for each program and are held by the committee chair. At such time that programs in probationary status request reinstatement, programs will be reviewed again by a TPR committee member for compliance.

A list of program contacts as well as a list of programs and their status is attached.

Action Points:

1. All the previous and historical paperwork including applications, forms, etc needs to be scanned in and put together for the reference of the committee. Since there is so much turn over it would be helpful to have this information for reference when we are reviewing applications, etc.
2. Method for Board of Governors to notify programs of their status. Need a formal letter from the board annually to confirm.
