Resume of your experience in avian medicine (recent positions, please give employer name, title, type of work and years spent)

From year 2000 to 2008 I was carrying out Poultry Consulting work in Canada as a self employed consultant. Besides carrying out some general poultry consulting my main focus was working with Chicken Processing Companies especially in Canada. The focus of my work was a program that we called Poultry Improvement Program. We were monitoring the bruising in the plants and identifying the bruising according to the Poultry Intellimetrics Program. Using this information on the farm, catching, hauling, unloading and in the plant we were able to reduce the damage and cost related to bruising, downgrading and loss or products, efficiencies etc.

From year 2002 to present I was involved with Mission work in Africa and other places related to poultry work and poverty alleviation. This work became fulltime in 2008. Here I worked for Christian Veterinary Missions of Canada (CVMC) as executive director and currently starting 20010 as Missions director. Address here is same as the above.

1998 to 2000 Vice-President of Qualtiy Assurance and Production of Integrated Poultry Limited (IPL), Newfoundland, Canada - Oversight of all Quality Assurance and Broiler Production of an integrated broiler company.
